Ohio Day

Fifteen of us from Zanesville as well as several other Episcopalians from the eastern part of the diocese boarded a bus to head east. It was a delightful spring day and the scenery was ever-changing and beautiful. Our hotel was in the heart of the city, within walking distance of many of the treasures of our national capital. The Metro even stopped at the hotel.

In all, four bus loads of Ohioans, two from the Diocese of Ohio and two from the Diocese of Southern Ohio converged making a delegation of 200 people. What fun to see all of those Episcopalians milling around. Friday evening at dinner Carol Cavinee and I met Tom and Gretchen Green, former members of St. James, who now live in the Diocese of Ohio.

Saturday morning we went to the Church of the Epiphany a few blocks away where a speaker from the Episcopal Policy Network explained its workings within the government. Judy Woodruff from PBS news, an Episcopalian by way of Baptist and Methodist, spoke about her over 30 years in Washington and answered questions.

Some of the travelers went off in the afternoon to do service projects and others went sightseeing. (Some took short afternoon naps but I won't name names.)

Sunday we were off to the St. Peter and St. Paul's better known as the National Cathedral. We had time to brose the Cathedral shop and to peek into some of the beautiful chapels that are part of the cathedral before assembling for the service. How thrilling to see our own St. James banner in the processional. Hank Wendorf from St. John, Cambridge was honored to be one of the chalicers. And of course our bishops, Thomas Breidenthal and Mark Hollingsworth were guest presiders. Following the eucharist we boarded our buses to return to Ohio.

The ECW of Trinity Newark extends an invitation to the women of St. James to join them for a June outing.

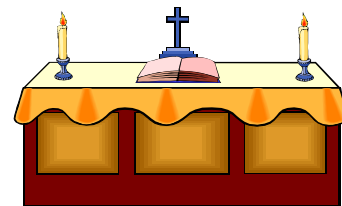
On Wednesday, June 9, we are invited to Trinity for a short meeting and a tour of the church. Following the tour we will go to The Works for lunch and fellowship.

April 21, 2010
